The Board of Trustees is pleased to present a budget with a 1.26% increase which complies with the New York State tax cap.

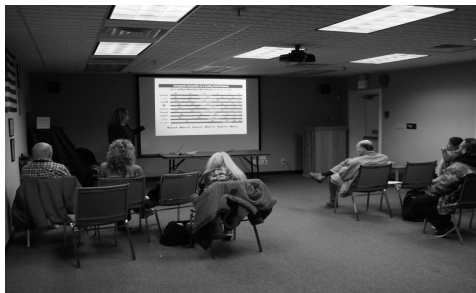
