You will no longer need to purchase paper in advance to print. Secure Printing will allow you to pay and print at our black & white/color copier.

Secure Printing allows you to send a document to the copier, but not have it actually be printed until *you* "release" it.

This can be useful when printing confidential documents that you do not want left sitting at a local computer.
